Hermes – the Trickster and Prophet

Hermes in the Homeric Hymn to Hermes shows a number of characteristics well known from the Archaic epic tradition, especially his inventiveness, trickery and association with livestock and darkness. He also acquires the authority to issue some prophecy at the end of the Hymn. This may be surprising given that Apollo asserts his ultimate authority as the god of oracle in the poem. Hermes' prophetic power, however, differs in nature from Apollo's because of his nature as trickster. This paper will examine the interplay of the aspects of Hermes the deceiver and Hermes the prophet within the Hymn as well as the forerunners of his characteristics in the Iliad and Odyssey, especially in the characters of Odysseus, Athena and Hermes himself.
