E) Title of the lecture: 'Manipulating audiences: the rhetoric of deception in Herodotus' *Histories*'

F) Abstract of the lecture (676 characters):

This paper explores the nature of deception and its effectiveness as a means of persuasion in Herodotus' *Histories*. I will focus on manifestations of deception in speech parts (quoted either in direct or indirect discourse), and I shall try to show how the narrative interacting with the speech unmasks the several kinds of trickery employed. The examples I shall discuss involve both Greek and Persian speakers and audiences. My purpose is twofold: first, to establish deception as a successful means of persuasion, which most often elicits a positive response from the audience, be it Greek or Persian; then, to propose that

exploring the rhetoric of deception may give a deeper insight in the nuanced way Herodotus deals with the Graeco-Persian polarity and the relationship between speech and power.
